



All went to their own towns to be registered. Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house and family of David. He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged and who was expecting a child. While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in bands of cloth, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. WATCHUNG CONVOCATION: RETIRING MEDICAL DEBT

Thanks to your generosity the **Watchung Convocation has raised over \$33,000 for this effort!** (This means approximately \$3.3 million of medical debt will be retired. A donation of \$1 retires \$100 of medical debt.) One of the leading causes of bankruptcy in the US is medical debt. Existing medical debt also prevents people from seeking the help they need to stay healthy. Our Convocation (16 Episcopal churches in our region) has took on the challenge this fallto help retire medical debt. In NJ, the state used leftover federal Covid relief funds to work with Undue Medical Debt to retire the debt of NJ residents. We pooled our resources to buy medical debt for pennies on the dollar to give relief to people in Navajoland (3 counties in New Mexico) and El Paso County, TX.
