



RETIRING MEDICAL DEBT

Thanks to your generosity the **Watchung Convocation has raised over \$33,000 for this effort!** (This means approximately \$3.3 million of medical debt will be retired.) Thank you very much. One of the leading causes of bankruptcy in the US is medical debt. Existing medical debt also prevents people from seeking the help they need to stay healthy. Our Convocation (16 Episcopal churches in our region) took on the challenge to help retire medical debt. In NJ, the state has used leftover federal Covid relief funds to work with Undue Medical Debt to retire the debt of NJ residents. Looking to another state in need, we will pool our resources to buy medical debt for pennies on the dollar to give relief to people in Navajoland (3 counties in New Mexico) and El Paso County, TX.
